From the Desk of Rabbi Rebecca P. Shinder

I have a confession: I love saying "Merry Christmas!" Please don't misunderstand me. I do not long to celebrate the Christian interpretation and observance of the Winter Solstice. I have neither desire to decorate a tree, nor have to hang a stocking. However, I revel in the shared sense of community - whether real or imagined - during the "holiday season." Of course, it is fabulous that Hanukkah has become more and more recognized by the general population, but that shift in the mainstream is for another article, for another time.

I would like to talk about the shift in individualism during this time of year. I would like for us all to be mindful of and remember how it feels when a stranger takes the time to look us in the eye, smile (hopefully behind his/her mask), and wish us well. 2021 has been yet another painful, dark, and difficult year. Yes, in this past year, we have seen that Covid -19 numbers still are on the rise, fires and tornados have raged, and we still see no evidence to the end of racial injustice perpetrated against our fellow human beings. With this acknowledgement, there is the possibility for us to act differently and make individual contributions to ameliorate the world in which we live. In other words, we can do what we Jews call tikkun olam, work actively to repair our broken world. Where to begin? We each can do our part to mitigate the spread of the coronavirus in the new year, we each can do our part to reduce our carbon footprint in the new year, we each can do our part to stand witness and speak out against injustice when we can.

As a young climate activist has said, "no action is too small." This can mean making sure that we, our family, friends, and neighbors are vaccinated and boosted, this can mean rebooting our commitment to that powerful trio of reuse/reduce/recycle AND being sure that elected officials (both local and national) acknowledge the scientific data that tells us that our climate is in crisis, and that can mean when you see evidence of racial injustice, you say and do something. This last point, no doubt, will be challenging. Not many of us have easy access and opportunity to do this holy work. Members of TBS began this process with dialogues during a Havdalah Hangout when our fellow Americans took to the streets in protest during the previous summer, and in an Adult Education Series called How to be an Antiracist. In order to continue this conversation, I suggest that you read a book by that same title by Ibram X. Kendi and Caste by Isabel Wilkerson.

I began this article by writing about a shared sense of merriment during the holiday season. I strenuously encourage congregants of all ages to participate in our next Yachad program Sunday, January 9th 10-12 on Zoom-bit.ly/tbsschool in order to learn about the shared legacy we Jews and African Americans once acknowledged and that motivated a movement demanding civil rights for all. We do this in advance of honoring and remembering the prophetic and important work of both Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel. Via our Zoom stained glass windows, we will watch the groundbreaking documentary Shared Legacy and learn about and join in the advocacy done by our Union for Reform Judaism for racial justice. This will be a program for our school aged students, post B'nei Mitzvah seeking Confirmation, teenagers who want to learn more about this past and prescient issue, and for adults who once marched and demanded change when they were teenagers. Moreover, especially since this film and conversation will be shared on Zoom, feel free to welcome guests of any age, race, or religion. Guests are absolutely encouraged and invited, but due to zoom security, they will need to follow some prompts to register in advance of the screening. The zoom room will open at 9:45 am.

Filmmaker Shari Rogers shares often forgotten stories of the coalition and friendship between the Jewish and African American communities during the civil rights movement. 


