# From the Desk of Rabbi Rebecca P. Shinder

Chavayot - this will be the year of Experiences...

I hope that you all had a summer of refreshment, renewal, and reading! Whether you have or not, you have the opportunity to either keep it going or commit to not letting the chance to accomplish these things pass you by. How? **Shabbat!** As Reform Jews, we need not focus on the restrictions that "keeping Shabbat" can impose. Rather, we can use the time to hike or drive to see nature's splendor, listen to a favorite podcast or musical score, and come to temple to connect with community and even ourselves.

But what does this necessarily have to do with the Hebrew word "chavaya" or the plural, chavayot? This commitment to experiences will be made manifest in our worship, mitzvah projects, and school (Beit Sefer.) The last Shabbat of each month will feature a shortened informal service in-the-round followed by a discussion. I write this article in advance of our inaugural chavaya on August 25th - that discussion centers on the social justice issues presented in the summer blockbusters known as Barbieheimer. The next Shabbat Chavaya will be September 29th. Watch for details and set aside the evening for wine and cheese, as well as community and conversation.

Perhaps the biggest chavaya of the year will take place on the Second Day of Rosh Hashana as an informal lakeside holiday experience. There will be more specifics in this volume, however, I want you to know that this idea is both for you and your family, as well as your friends and neighbors who may not feel comfortable with a service within the four walls of a sanctuary. The goal is for us to be in nature, that is to say for us to celebrate the creation of our world out IN the world. There will be a brief service with our "greatest hits" of Shabbat melodies, the sounding of Shofar, and a private moment for Tashlich - the custom of symbolically casting away any misdeeds done in the past year with the casting of bread into a moving body of water. There will be crafts and games for the kiddos and, of course, food for all.

This is a new experience for our community. I had a vision of this program and asked a great deal of our already overworked volunteers. I ask that if you have never stepped forward to volunteer before or haven't in a while, that you offer to lend a hand to make this event a success. I believe that we have a chance to reach out to our "hidden yidden" (or unaffiliated Jewish neighbors) - in a way that could be of great impact. Write to tbs-ny@optonline.net and be a part of the success of this experience.

Another form of chavaya will be a part of Beit Sefer, our joint school with the Monroe Temple. Our opening experience will feature a guest artist who will explore the concept of bayit (home) through the creation of collages. There will be a box in our social hall for you to donate magazines you think would be useful for this project. We'll recycle anything that is not used. This experience will be October 15th at TBS and learners of all ages are invited to participate. Our next chavaya will be with the creator of Movemeant and will feature study combined with music and dance.

Finally, chavayot will also come in the form of mitzvah projects. October 14th will be the Bat Mitzvah of Abigail Horowitz and we encourage all congregants, especially the students of Beit Sefer, to attend the 10AM service. In advance of this blessed event at 8AM that Saturday, we call upon our TBS mitzvah makers to volunteer with Marcia Mattheus at the Goshen Ecumenical Food Pantry for a Food Give Away.

In conclusion, I look forward to welcoming in 5784 with all of you. May this be a good year of health, learning, and chavayot. *L'Shana Tova, Rabbi Shinder*


