From the Desk of Rabbi Rebecca P. Shinder

At the writing of this article, we are at Day 116 of Israelis citizens and soldiers being held hostage in Gaza. We know that the fate of these human beings is one of three possible outcomes: either they were released, they were killed, or they are still hidden away in a tunnel. How the hostages are treated in their bondage remains an unthinkable and painful possibility. We feel helpless, but I encourage you to Google: **bringthemhomenow** to learn more about these men, women and children who remain in shadows.

As we just read in the Torah the legend of the Children of Israel crossing over the Sea of Reeds, I am mindful that the story of our people includes times of us being in great darkness. We were held in Egyptian bondage and the Hebrew word for Egypt is Mitzrayim. Another way to translate this word to English is "the narrow places." Certainly being held in a Hamas tunnel is very much a narrow place - both literally and figuratively. How can we have hope when we see the smiling faces on those posters or at the installations of empty Shabbat dinner tables? When we remember that our collective story is ultimately one of redemption. This is part of the Passover narrative: "Once we were bondsmen in Egypt, now we are free."

For the past several months, I have been thinking about how to support and inform our TBS kids, especially those who are studying on college campuses. I tried to schedule an information session at the tail end of winter break with Mike Isseks, the organizer and teacher of discussions for adults both at the Monroe Temple and at TBS. Alas, timing did not work, but I sent via their parents two some sources that I think could provide both helpful and easily accessible information. This information with not prevent them from being exposed to the unfiltered higher education's marketplace of free ideas (which is code for allowing chants of "From the River to the Sea") on campus but the timeline of Israel's journey over 3,000 years provides a succinct history of our people living in the Land. Feel free to post, forward, or send this timeline via carrier pigeon to stop the misinformation campaign that falsely claims that the Jewish people are colonizers who seek the genocide of the Palestinian people. A simple talking point to counter such a claim is that **Israel is not at war with the Palestinian people. Israel is at war with Hamas.** To be a bit less succinct: **Israel is at war with the Hamas terrorists who murdered and tortured over 1200 men, women, and children on October 7.** Today 120 Israelis are still being held captive. The morning after the attack, the international community was horrified that Hamas shot babies and kidnapped grandmas. Three months later, we see that factors such as unregulated social media have changed that once humane reaction. Throughout the world, nations use anti-Zionism as code for antisemitism and do not acknowledge that the unfortunate collateral damage of civilian deaths are the direct result of Hamas terrorists hiding among them.

But back to the timelinge facts -- even better: these facts are with pictures! This Israel timeline is produced by StandWithUs (a.k.a. Israel Emergency Alliance)

If you and your children are seeking more information, once again, I recommend the very digestible book *Israel: A Simple Guide to the Most Misunderstood Country on Earth* by Noah Tishby. Seriously, this book of history opens with a story of the author getting McDonald's with her family at a Tel Aviv mall! Among her many accomplishments, Tishby is successful Israeli actress, American TV producer, and advocate for Israel. She weaves her historical narrative with pop culture references and gives accessible information about timely issues such as the BSD (Boycott, Sanction, and Divest) movement and how this anti-Israeli products campaign began on college campuses in America even though it is funded by sources in Iran.

So what do we do when we feel helpless? Get informed and when you hear something, say something. Ask questions when you think a person has made a baseless statement about Israel. Even asking people if they could see the difference between saying that Israel is at war with the Palestinians as opposed to saying that Israel is a war with Hamas is a terrific first step. By the way, it's not just college kids who are aware of the conflict. We've discussed in Beit Sefer how this is an upsetting time and how it is important to share love and support for the IDF soldiers, but we do not have the ability to unpack the 3,000 year timeline with them. Please talk with them about how you feel, what you know, and even what you still hope to know.

Finally, prayer is always a good option! Our Friday night Shabbat services continue on Zoom (bit.ly/tbsservices) at 7PM through the end of February – EXCEPT for a Beit Sefer lead service on February 9th in Monroe. The evening will begin at 5:30PM with a dinner for all congregants from both communities. The children will then take an active role in a 6:30PM service.
