From the Desk of Rabbi Rebecca P. Shinder

Eitz chayim hee l'machazimkeba

It is a Tree of Life to all who hold fast to it and all of it's supporters are happy. Proverbs 3:18

Our sanctuary contains a multitude of images representing this passage. Most notably are our Torah scrolls that are adorned with colorful covers that provide an ornate collage of a Tree of Life. I have been teaching children a melody of this text complete with claps for nearly 40 years. For the purpose of this article, I choose not to reflect on the inheritors of Torah (the cute young ones who cling to stuffed versions of our ancient scrolls), but I would like to discuss those who literally have supported our community so that Torah is taught, preserved, and passed on the future generations.

In keeping with the tried and true methodology of a three-point sermon, it occurs to me that three events have brought me to this theme.

The first came to me as a very generous gift of meticulously detailed pictures by Norma Susswein Saks. Thanks to Norma, who in a similarly detailed correspondence, says that she and her late sister, Carol Ann Susswein, z"l (zichrono livracha, may her memory be for a blessing) were among the first children in the Hebrew School. She says that to this day she, "has warm memories of friendships established [at the temple]." Thanks to Norma, we have this image that serves as a Time Capsule of the Florida Hebrew Community Center.



We will add this and her other pictures to our collection, but for the purposes of this article, I would like to focus on this particular image. As you might imagine, this processional is led by the rabbi who is carrying a prayer book from the parsonage to the sanctuary. Norma's father, Max Susswein, and her grandfather, Samuel Israel, are carrying the front poles of the chuppah. The man carrying the Torah under the chuppah is Maxwell Friedman. continued on page 12

CO~PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Shalom Chaverim

The next time you are at temple, I invite you to look at the wall on the first floor which connects the 'new' education wing (which is now 25 years old!). On that wall are plaques which honor some of the founding families of Temple Beth Shalom. Some may have not been here at the very beginning in 1947, but they were all instrumental in keeping our family of families alive throughout the years.

This week, Robin Rosenberg Cohen passed away. The Rosenberg family are one of the families, whom, for well over 70 years, if not more, have supported our shul. Back in the late



90s, when we were in a true need of space for our burgeoning Hebrew School, the Rosenbergs underwrote the education wing of our shul. You will see that the wing is named the Viola and William Rosenberg Education Center. Although she lived in the state of Florida, Robin Cohen was always a supporter of TBS. Her son William, although a state of Florida resident, was called to Torah at TBS.

The passing of Robin Cohen and the upcoming unveiling of Howard Cohen has left me to think about TBS' future – L'Dor V'Dor. Howard was the son of Helen Cohen (whom the restoration of the kitchen was done in her honor) and Helen was the sister of Jerry Neustadt. Jerry and Shirley Neustadt were an integral part of Temple Beth Shalom throughout their lives. Remember the old movie theater chairs? Jerry showed up one day with them. Prior to those chairs, there were folding chairs! And Shirley was a founding member of Sisterhood. She continued to join in Sisterhood events whenever she could through her late 80s!

Debbie Werner, is the last (I believe) living of TBS' founding members. Well into her 90s, she is taken care of lovingly by her family. Debbie always came to High Holiday services with her daughter Cindy. We loved seeing Debbie and she loved to still be a part of TBS. The Werners, Rosenbergs, Neustadts, Gordons, and many, many, more families (look around the building and read the names on plaques and memorial boards) have built and sustained our family of families since 1947. We are grateful for their vision and support.

Now it's up to us. Our sanctuary and social hall have been (beyond) beautifully update thanks to the Hannes family. The Bordman family updated the kitchen with a marble countertop. We also have anonymous angels who have helped with the roof, real estate taxes and more. A (very) few members successfully organize events for all to participate in. Necessity, due to low class sizes, created a new school, Beit Sefer, with Monroe Temple. Rabbi Shinder was incredibly instrumental in developing the curriculum, along with the Beit Sefer team.

We continue to talk merger with Monroe Temple. The sale of their building failed and they are putting the building back on the market. We are still Temple Beth Shalom. We continue to work with our very slim budget and volunteers. Yes, merging with Monroe Temple will help sustain Reform Judaism in Orange County, but, right here, right now, I urge you to pay your dues by June 30, start paying your Building Fund assessment and most importantly, volunteer to help in any way you would like to. Don't know how to help but want to? Call or email me. We not only need your dues, we need you — to join us during Shabbat Services and events and to volunteer.

May we continue to go from strength to strength.

Maxwell donated this scroll to the temple and its original cover is preserved in the burgundy tapestry hanging in our sanctuary. This different kind of time capsule was prepared lovingly by Deb Weber. There will be time to discuss the important imagery and ritual of a Torah scroll being escorted into a synagogue, but for the purpose of this article, I do neither wish to discuss the union of the scroll with the congregation nor the rabbi who led the ceremony. I need to talk about how the nine men at the center of the frame gave of their time and their resources both symbolically and literally for the boy on the right of the picture. For his sake and for the sake of his contemporaries and the children that would come after them, did those founders, those donors, and those doers create and sustain our congregation. To be sure, there are lists and lists of "founding fathers and mothers!" of our congregation. If you have not done so, I urge you to read more about them by going to our website and click on history: tbsny.org/ about/5917-2. Their gifts were extraordinary and none were nor are considered too small or too insignificant. To this day, if someone fries a latke, or teaches a class, or organizes a barbeque, or sings in our choir, or replaces a lightbulb, or shows up at funeral or Shivah to make a minyan, or helps to tell the story of Purim while dressed as a pirate...it matters and it makes a difference.

So if supporting the maintenance of our communal Tree of Life can be done in a myriad of ways why should I mention the original forward thinking Jewish leaders at this time? I do so because of the second point of this article. In this past year, we have lost two descendants of this generous generation who have maintained their parents loving generosity to our congregation. Last Spring, Howard Cohen, z"l, the son of the late Herman & Helen Cohen, z"l, passed away. If you or your children were named, became B'nai Mitzvah or a Confirmand, or were married by me, you and I signed a document with what I call our Temple Beth Shalom Mitzvah pen. I explain how Howard, z"l, a masterful collector of many things including pens, felt that the temple needed the pen more than he did. This Mitzvah pen is a blue and white Mont Blanc that was commissioned for the 60th anniversary of the establishment of the Land of Israel. I use the pen to establish a teachable moment both for why we here in Florida, NY need to care about Israel and about the power of community. As for the latter lesson, I tell people how Howard Cohen, z"l, grew up in this temple and that even though he moved to Massachusetts, he continued to be a member and came home when he could to attend services and visit our cemetery. Howard honored his parents with specific needs such as renovating our kitchen, funding our relatively new acquisitions of prayer books for Shabbat and the High Holidays and he made annual donations to our general operating fund. Howard did give a generous and final gift to our temple. He could have been that boy in Norma's picture. In so many ways was the man who carried the Torah.

In late February, after a eight year battle with and defiance of pancreatic cancer, Robin Cohen, z''l passed away. Like Howard, Robin's parents gave generously to TBS. If you or your children learned in an upstairs classroom or used the handicap ramp, you did so thanks to the building/people power of many TBS generous and talented volunteers and because of the financial support of Robin's late parents, the late Richard and Viola Rosenberg. Like Howard, Robin continued to be a member even though her prime residence was the state of Florida. Also like Howard, Robin continued to make yearly contributions to our temple. Unlike Howard, in 2013 she was able to make manifest our value of L'Dor Vador when her son William became a Bar Mitzvah in our sanctuary. Robin came to services when she could and read our Shofar religiously. So much so that she would often call me for clarification. For example, although the shared name might suggest otherwise she and Howard Cohen, z''l were not related, Since they did have a shared history of being temple kids together, she called when she read about his death to find out more.

The next phone call tied her to her parents. When she read about our Beit Sefer and potential future merger with The Monroe Temple, Robin worried and wondered if we would still be in this building. Robin could have been a girl that appeared in Norma's picture. In so many ways she was the man who carried the Torah.

In congregations both large and small, not all members are able to pay their dues and/or Religious School fees in full. In congregations both large and small, very few congregants are able to make donations beyond the High Holiday Appeal. Financial engagement is important, but also in congregations both large and small, remaining an active participating member family matters. If that Torah processional was only for a handful of donors, there would not be much of a congregation. We are a family of families when we show up for each other and do what we can. So this brings me to my third and final point. In recent years, even before Covid, the number of our members had diminished. I ask that you join in our resolve to preserve Reform Judaism in Orange County. Our Beit Sefer is a fantastic first step to that goal. Classes take place in our building on Sundays this March. Please come at 9:30 am (especially if your child is a registered student!) for a bagel and schmooze. You may meet someone from the Monroe Temple, and you may just meet a fellow congregant you do not know. On Sunday March 3rd, Mike Isseks, will lead another informative conversation for adults about Israel. The program begins at 10, but the coffee, nosh, and schmoozing begin at 9:30. I encourage you to come. Michael Melasky's Hebrew class has begun the Spring Semester, but I bet he won't turn you away if you come to learn, also with a nosh!! On March 24th Beit Sefer will convene for a Magillah Reading/Learning and Purim Carnival at Temple Beth Jacob in Newburgh. Again, the goal is to increase participation among progressive Jews in Orange County.

On March 9th, our temple will host a NFTY Disney Day for 8th - 12th grade teens from congregations in Orange County and to its north in New York and to the south in New Jersey. The program is from 2-8pm and will not cost TBS anything other than people power. We especially call upon parents of this age group to encourage their kids to participate and to lend a hand in set up, clean up, serving a meal and/or chaperoning. Before Covid, in December 2020, Holli Teshome and Mindy Hazzard organized our Junior Youth Group to attend a weekend event called A Taste of NFTY. Our Little Shul That Could sent one of the largest groups in our region to the URJ Camp Harlam. Those kids are now Juniors and Seniors in High School. Please encourage them to come and please do your part to give of your time. Perhaps on March 9th, you too will meet a member you don't know yet.


