## From the Desk of Rabbi Rebecca P. Shinder



When Hannah was a young girl, she learned a Passover song while a student at Solomon Schecter Jewish Day School. With limitless gusto she sang verse after verse about the ritual objects Jews use during a Seder. Much like the game of "I'm going on a picnic and I am bringing..." participants repeat and add items with each ensuing verse. This song goes on and on to list items such as a Seder

plate, matzah, cups, candles, etc. as each verse begins with, "These are the things we need at our Seder table." The tune is catchy and light, however this year the refrain provided a palpable lesson of thanksgiving and gratitude to our family.

This was not a triumph for the ecological kashrut to which I aspire, my profound apologies to the environment on this front. This was not a year to polish fine ritual objects or pack items Larry and I received as wedding gifts. This was a year to adapt our holiday observance to honor the spirit of Hannah's song. Truly, all of the people around the table are what we need the most. We weren't quite sure in what health care facility we would have our first night of Passover, but one thing was absolutely certain to me - we would spend it together. We actually made friends with the relatives of other residents and traded traditions and stories with one another.

In addition to all the themes of Passover, this was a year to give thanks for my father's redemption from his almost three weeks in the hospital. This was also a year to reform the meaning of the Seder's conclusion. Our "l'shana ha'ba-ah/next year in Jerusalem" is the aspiration that my father's kidneys and heart function return to healthy levels.

Every Shabbat, we join with Jews around the world in prayer for the healing of body and spirit of our loved ones. My dad receives great physical care which includes dialysis, physical therapy and occupational therapy. Hopefully sometime soon, he will undergo a cardiac procedure to increase his blood flow. In the meantime, the support we all have received from so many members of the Temple Beth Shalom family of families has lifted the spirits of my entire family. The well wishes, prayers, cards, and paintings from our Beit Sefer students adorn his hearth and heart!

My prayer for us all is to value and appreciate our special spaces and places we and our loved ones share. Not all times of sanctity will occur during mountain top moments. However, I urge you to be open, make and take the time to be present with one another because, "the people around the table are what we need the most." *Fondly, Rabbi Shinder*


