From the Desk of Rabbi Rebecca P. Shinder



Behold this image taken in 1995
Jerusalem of a subset of The Ben
Yehuda Street Players. You may
wonder how the baby could hold
her harmony lines or when did
Hannah learn to play the guitar.
Baby Iliana was the strong but
silent type, and that's me holding
the guitar next to my dear friend
Rabbi Cantor Angela Warnick
Buchdahl. This is one of the
mitzvah projects I helped
coordinate during my first year as
a rabbinical student at the Hebrew

Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion. Although far from signing a record deal, we future rabbis, cantors, and educators would busk every Friday morning on the busy Jerusalem walking mall (midrochov) to tourists who wanted to hear our version of tunes ranging from Simon & Garfunkel to The Beatles to Billy Joel to some modern Israeli pop music. After each set, a classmate introduced us as the future leadership of the Reform Movement and made an appeal for folks to toss some shekels into a guitar case to support various causes throughout the city.

I would take the spoils of the morning's performance to Bank Leumi (which BTW was founded on February 27, 1902 in Tel Aviv-Yafo/Jaffa!) and ask a very patient clerk to convert a bag of agarot (think nickles, dimes & quarters) and smaller coin shekelim (think Canadian \$1 and \$2 loonies and toonies) into larger paper shekel bills. I then took this "music money" to a florist in order to buy flowers for patients in Shaarei Tzedek Hospital. With the ice breaker of flowers in hand, I performed the mitzvah of visiting the sick, bikur cholim, as a 'rabbi in training' mostly in Hebrew. I did share smiles, flowers, and a 'Shabbat Shalom' with a Russian immigrant who could neither speak Hebrew or English. On my way out of her room, I conjured up a line from an Indiana Jones film. Although it was sinisterly delivered to Dr. Jones in the movie, I turned around and said to the patient with a quizzical smile "Dasvidaniya?" She laughed and smiled and said goodbye to me in her language about 5 times!

That exchange took place 30 years ago and I remember as if it was yesterday. The Ben Yehuda Street Players' profits made that magical mitzvah moment possible. This May will mark 25 years since those young rabbinical students were ordained. After earning a Masters of Arts in Hebrew Letters, a Master of Arts in Jewish Studies, coursework approaching the conferring a PhD, after 25 years of devoted service to the Jewish people and the larger world, each of those now older and wiser rabbis will be conferred as a Doctor of Divinity.

Music has been a part of my rabbinical journey since those Ben Yehuda Street days, those Havdalah ceremonies under the Jerusalem and desert skies, through my years as a Cantorial Intern at The Reform Temple of Suffern, through my TBS interview in 2005.

On February 8th our Shabbat Shira Service & Luncheon will continue that musical connection. While different from The Ben Yehuda Street Players, musicians of all ages from both temples will join in song, prayer, and community to elevate a Shabbat experience like no other. Our dedicated volunteers have chosen a New Orleans theme for our luncheon. There will be no organized busking during the lunch, but we hope you throw some 'paper shekels' in our puske to support this event. I'll see you there and Laissez les bon temps rouler! Just come and let the good times roll! *Rabbi Shinder*

CO-PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Shalom Chaverim,

We are in the depths of winter and boy is it cold outside! But there is something that warms my heart, over the past few weeks I see images of Israeli hostages being released back into the loving arms of friends and family! Well over a year in the dangerous hands of captivity by Hamas. What an incredibly difficult time that must have been to survive, and what could possibly have gone through their minds during captivity? It reminds me in some ways of a book I am currently reading, the



autobiography of Geddy Lee. Who you say? The bassist and lead singer of the Canadian rock group RUSH! To me, the greatest rock group of all-time! Rock-n-roll, parties, how does this possibly correlate? Well, let me introduce Geddy Lee a different way. Born Gershon Eliezer Weinrib, named after his Grandfather, who was murdered in the Holocaust, son of parents who luckily survived the horrors of Auschwitz and Bergen-Belsen concentration camps.

Stories told to Geddy in his childhood from his mother Malka, truly resonated with me. Ready to read about my favorite band and their rise to stardom, I was instead reading one of the most captivating Holocaust stories I have ever read. We do find out what was going through the minds of those in captivity, as Malka states upon liberation from Bergen-Belsen on April 15, 1945, "When we were told to come out, and that we were free, we could not believe it. We were in shock. We had assumed there was no one left alive to save us, otherwise why had they not come sooner?" This story did indeed become a RUSH song named 'Red Sector A'.

"Are we the last ones left alive? Are we the only human beings to survive?" Lyrics by Neil Peart, the drummer, who took Geddy's stories and crafted some of the finest rock music. Geddy's parents were married at Bergen-Belsen shortly after liberation! As Geddy put it, 'quite a destination for a wedding!' Geddy's autobiography is titled 'My Effin' Life' if you are interested, or perhaps when I am finished reading my copy!

Staying with the theme of music, and perhaps to demonstrate our freedoms and perseverance as a people, it is our turn to gather as congregants and enjoy one another's company in a musical Sabbath of Singing!




