## From the Desk of Rabbi Rebecca P. Shinder

Our tradition provides us with endless examples of opposites: light contrasting with darkness in the creation story, the separation of holy versus profane time, and the distinction between kosher versus traif food and ritual objects are but a few. Although this year of 5785 presents symmetry between the first day of March with the first day of the Hebrew month of Adar, we discover yet one more stark contrast between the frivolity and fun of Purim with the recent unspeakable sorrow shared concerning the fate of the Bibas family. In anticipation



of Purim, the Talmud asserts that "joy increases with the arrival of Adar," yet after 16 months of still awaiting the return of all the remaining hostages in Gaza, this instruction may feel too difficult to manage.

Yet, a deeper dive into that Talmudic text (Ta'anit 29A) may provide a model, for it too contains a contrast, one between lamentation and celebration. The first refers to the Hebrew month of Av, the time during which tradition asserts both the First and Second Temples were destroyed (in 586 BCE and 70 CE repectively). According to Rav Yehuda, "Just as when Av begins one decreases rejoicing, so too when the month of Adar begins, one increases rejoicing." In other words in spite of the theological and national trauma experienced as a result of those tremendous losses, the rabbinic tradition modeled a path forward. "Decreasing joy" may seem to be an inadequate response to this latest tragedy, or maybe it is an invitation to continue in spite of it.

Although the story of Purim includes tragic edicts, gruesome violence, and a most likely X-rated beauty contest, this holiday has taken on lighthearted fun, especially our children. With great ceremony we read Megillat Esther, where despite evil counselors and foolish kings, all turns out well, and we are commanded to shout and sing and drink and eat in celebration. But what if we don't feel like celebrating? What if, especially now, we're not feeling the joy? Perhaps the answer comes from the megillah itself, the Book of Esther states "That month" – this very month of Adar we are about to enter – "was reversed for them from grief to joy" (Esther 9:22). In other words, the month of Adar was declared a month of happiness, not because the people were already joyful but because they experienced grief. The month of Adar asks us to reach down into ourselves, despite the pain that might surround us, and to find joy within ourselves, and to reverse our grief, even if only for a short time.

Back to that opening contrast from the Creation story, despite the evidence that we now face darkness, we must also remember our sources of light. Whereas we must never forget how the Bibas brothers' black shrouded coffins were paraded ruthlessly by Hamas, we must also never forget how those beautiful red headed boys smiled in countless image after image with their beloved family and friends. Most of all as we await Purim, I ask that you remember their matching Batman costumes and remember that, now more than ever, we should create a space to celebrate Purim. Many have gathered in these weeks under Orange illuminated landmarks and/or with orange balloons in memory of Ariel and Kfir's brightly illuminated hair. Others have taken to social media to post messages with orange backgrounds to their non-Jewish friends to speak of the pain, fear, and isolation this time has brought. Others still speak of the importance of performing mitzvot in honor of the entire Bibas family. Perhaps not so coincidentally, there happens to be 4 mitzvot associated with Purim.

Not only do I encourage you to seek out the various services and programs offered by Temple Beth Shalom, but I also encourage you to encourage your kids at college, your adult children, your Jewish neighbors, your Jewish friends on Facebook, to do the same. If getting to a specific place or creating something on your own is challenging then head to the web for finding something appropriate. The four mitzvot are as follows:

- 1. Hearing the Megillah
- 2. Mishloach Manot Giving gifts to friends
- 3. Matanot LaEvyonim Giving gifts to the poor
- 4. Purim Seudah A special Purim feast

We will have two opportunities to hear highlights from the Scroll of Esther.

The first will be during our Informal Shabbat Purim Experience at 7pm on 3/14. Following a brief Shabbat service, there will be both adult and child centered tracts during the oneg. All are welcome to come in costume and Purim themed adult libations will be available. The second chance to hear Esther's story will take place Sunday, 3/16 at our temple for The Orange County Federation Purim Carnival. The doors will open at 9:30 for a light breakfast snack and socialization in our social hall. The mitzvah of hearing Megillah will be presented in our sanctuary by the K'lei Kodesh of various synagogues in the county. The carnival games led by our 6 & 7th graders will follow. The second mitzvah of the day of Matanot LaEvyonim – (Giving gifts to the poor) will be the participation fee per family of at least 5 non-perishable items or \$10 given to the Florida Food Pantry (cash, checks, or Venmo accepted). The mitzvah of the Purim Seudah – A special Purim feast will be the traditional hot dog lunch with chips, a drink, and hamantaschen for \$5 per person.

It's not too late to participate in The Mitzvah of Mishloach Manot – Giving gifts to friends. Through your donation, you may send a special holiday greeting to other families in the congregation. This year's program will benefit both TBS and The Hostage and Missing Families Forum.

Just as we light a third Shabbat candle in honor of those who remain in Gazan captivity, let us do at least one mitzvah of Purim in honor and memory of Ariel and K'fir. Do this for them, do this for you, and encourage anyone you can think of who, at a "time such as this" (Esther 4:14), instead of just saying "oy," could use some Jewish joy!

## CO~PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Shalom Chaverim,

As the snows thaw and we move into spring I wanted to give everyone a few updates:

First, an update on the status of our impending merger with the Monroe Temple of Liberal Judaism. When we voted as a congregation to approve a merge back in September (70 to 0!) we had expected Monroe would be sharing space with us by now. Obviously that has not happened yet. The sale of their building has been difficult, but Monroe is working with a new realtor and they are hopeful a sale can be completed in the summer. This will, of course, delay the process, but both the



TBS and Monroe boards remain committed to laying a solid foundation for what is to come. The executive boards of both congregations continue to meet regularly and discuss plans not only for what the new entity will look like, but how we can make the most of the transitionary period when we will be sharing space as two technically separate entities, but as one community in spirit.

Meanwhile, with each passing month we are making more concerted efforts to have joint activities. Whether that's shared services at TBS or Monroe, joint Men's Club or Sisterhood events or our already well-enmeshed Beit Seifer functions, there are many opportunities to get to know our Reform Jewish community at large. I continue to encourage everyone to find some time in your schedule for at least one of these events. The more we get to all know each other, the smoother the transition will be when it finally does happen. And rest assured, we are committed to making this happen!

Now in other exciting news that we can give you a more concrete timeline... The Pomerantz Memorial Garden is ploughing (and weeding and planting!) ahead, and we will be breaking ground and having a dedication ceremony on May 18th. Phase one of the project will include landscaping, a bubbling waterfall, benches, lighting, sound, and the dedication of the sculpture Rabbi Fred Pomerantz designed as a memorial for his son Jeremy many years ago. Phase two, date still TBD, will see the addition of pavers to complete the look and feel of this soon-to-be sacred and welcoming space.

But the garden is more than just a memorial. It is the future for bringing the community together; think of it as Orange County's Jewish cultural center. We'll be able to use this garden with the concepts of growth and variety for sharing our culture, our friendship and our openness, to unify the community in spirituality, learning, song, and prayer. We will be able to bring people together in a quiet and contemplative setting, but also in a joyous, festive event-filled environment where we can hold lectures, concerts, and more!

There will always be some darkness around us, difficulties in the world that feel at times oppressive. But we are a community that thrives on hope and optimism. So let us continue to hold these in abundance, as we move together toward an exciting future. *Jeff Hannes, Co-President, Temple Beth Shalom*


