From the Desk of Rabbi Rebecca P. Shinder

This month marks 77 years since the declaration of the modern State of Israel. The Jewish people have lived on this sacred space since antiquity, and throughout the millennia, we have known what Naomi Shemer penned in 1980 to be, "both the bitter and the sweet" realities of what life on this land can be. "Al Kol Ehleh, meaning" "For All These Things," has been embraced as an expression of a deep desire to protect loved ones, understanding that terrible things may come, praying for God's grace, alongside the ability to accept the good with the bad.

This month will mark another combination "bitter and sweet," for the Pomerantz personal and congregational families. The first taste of bitterness came with the painful illness and death of my 30 year old bold and dazzling brother, Jeremy Daniel, z"l (may his memory be remembered as a blessing). One attempt to temper that void ever so mildly, was to build a Memorial Garden for him at dad's previous congregation, Temple Beth El of Northern Valley in Closter, NJ. Another "sting" came when that building was sold and the promise to rebuild a similar space in their new and smaller space for a merged congregation was never fulfilled.

Many in our congregation have seen the beautiful images Gail Conklin took of my family in Jeremy Daniel's garden just prior to the Bar Mitzvah service of our son, Jeremy Todd. Almost a decade later, my father told Flo & Andy Hannes about the stalled project and how the sculpture he commissioned to capture a bit of Jeremy's essence remained in a storage locker. This conversation took place after one of dad's jazz/folk-rock Sim Shalom sacred concerts right before the Covid lockdown, and much like so many aspects of life back then, a shared vision to bring the garden to TBS was once more put on hold.





Time passed and the idea evolved to build a much more expansive garden in order to create a beautiful place for services and receptions, for memory and music, for lectures and gatherings at Temple Beth Shalom – not just for our congregation, but for the greater community of Orange County, as well. When the relatively newly retired Flo was home recuperating from a healthcare procedure of her own, she felt that the time seemed right to reclaim this project a little over a year ago. However, dad's health was fading and I knew that it was only a matter of time when he too would also be remembered for a blessing. That conversation took place in February and after multiple procedures, hospital and rehab stays, dialysis and so much more, on a sunny day in July, his light that once burned so bright ... dimmed.

It was during the second night of sitting Shiva when Flo spoke with me and my brother Josh (separately!!) and we decided that it was time to go ahead with planning and fundraising for this project. Although we did not at first announce to where people could send donations in dad's memory, once we did and TBS established a Pomerantz Memorial Garden Fund, thousands and thousands of dollars were sent to honor Rabbi Fred from friends and family, our temple members, and members of the three different temples my father served as their rabbi. Once word spread through various papers in NJ, Pittsburgh, and beyond, thousands more were sent in memory of both Rabbi and Jeremy Daniel Pomerantz. Since the establishment of the fund, many more have made donations in honor of simchas such as Sharon & Rich Ball's fiftieth wedding anniversary and Jeff Hannes' fiftieth birthday. Others still have made donations in memory of our administrator Kelly Gilliard's beloved late husband Tom.

Since July, Flo has made multiple dioramas based upon what she saw in the original garden, what she spoke about with my father, the suggestions that our resident congregational gardener extraordinaire and board member Shari Rake made, as well as her own creativity. The garden will bloom with flowering plants, will soar with Jeremy's dynamic sculpture, and will bubble with a removable water feature appropriate for all seasons. As of the publication of this Shofar, the Pomerantz Memorial Garden has garnered more than enough funds to build the first phase of this game changing project.

We look forward to the buzz that a renewed sacred space will bring. Please join our family of families for the Groundbreaking Ceremony on Sunday May 18th at 3pm. The final Beit Sefer session will take place that morning from 9:30 - 11:30 concluding with field games and an ice cream social. A formal invitation will go out to our temple members, to all the garden donors, and to various leaders within our greater community. The event will begin with cocktails & conversation during the garden's first concert given by the contemporary harmony-driven folk duo, The Levins, Ira & Julia, heightened worship alongside my dad at Congregation Agudas Achim for the past 10 years! The Groundbreaking Ceremony will be a sweet and creative way to celebrate, remember, and mark a new outlet for expression of community, Jewish joy and pride. Spread the word & I'll see you in the Garden!! More information with an RSVP will soon follow.


Donors usually return to their normal lifestyle within 2-4 weeks post-transplant, with Renewal available to cover lost wages.

Breakfast: We have a coffee maker. I will bring the milk and sugar and some breakfast treats. Please let me know, if and what, you are bringing to enhance our breakfast for our clients.

It's the beginning of May which indicates that there is less than 2 months until the end of TBS' fiscal year (July 1 - June 30) and to be totally honest and transparent, we do not have enough income for us to meet our expenses through the rest of the year.

Temple Beth Shalom is a vibrant community and house of worship. I do not exaggerate when I write that we are the most thriving Jewish community in Orange County. Beit Sefer, our religious school formed with Monroe Temple, boasts the most students in Hebrew school of any Orange County synagogue.

We may be vibrant and successful, yet we do not have enough

funds to pay our bills until the end of the year. Monroe has yet to sell their building, so renting to them while we continue the merge process will not be happening in the near future.


