From the Desk of Rabbi Rebecca P. Shinder

I open this article for our Summer Shofar not with a teaching from the Talmud, nor with a meaningful midrash, not even with a profound passage from the Biblical books of Numbers and Deuteronomy which will be read and studied from June to August. Whereas as I have spent a great deal of time this Spring reflecting on my journey to master and teach Jewish sacred texts for the past three decades, now on the precipice of a much needed summer respite, I am drawn once again to a philosophy I first studied in AP English class even earlier than my professional studies began. While the tenets of Reform Judaism are central to my identity, the values of Transcendentalism have been on my mind as of late. Ironically both post Enlightenment movements took root at the beginning of the nineteenth century.

Much can be discussed about the views on life and society of such luminaries as Ralph Waldo Emerson, Margaret Fuller and Bronson Alcott that were integral to what was regarded as quintessential American philosophy, for the sake of this Summer Shofar, I choose to highlight their focus, especially that of Henry David Thoreau, on the real beauty and value that was and still is found in the natural world. Modern day Warwick is not Thoreau's Walden and not even the same Warwick from 50 or even 20 years ago. Yet you know more than anyone the beauty that remains unspoiled beyond many bends in the road and downstream from duck ponds and daffodils.

As you seek out beautiful spots this summer here in Orange County or wherever your travels may take you, I encourage you to seek out and even document the natural wonders you encounter just as the Transcendentalists did a couple of centuries ago. You may be surprised by the lofty language you choose to describe the sounds, scents, and sights of your meanderings. Countless journal entries and published essays of Thoreau read as if they were passages from sacred texts. Although you may think it odd for me to suggest that you pack a bible in your beach bag or a prayer book in your purse, you could compose some prose that gives a higher meaning to a cocktail sunset cruise or a trip of your own into the woods. See what poems of praise you might be compelled to write. In Thoreau's log entitled A Week on the Concord and Merrimack Rivers, he wrote:

In reality, history fluctuates as the face of the landscape from morning to evening. What is of the moment is its hue and color. Time hides no treasures; we want not its then, but its now. We do not complain that the mountains in the horizon are blue and indistinct; they are more like the heavens.

Soon after we meet again in September, we will go not to Walden Pond, but to Seymour's Pond for our RH2 Experience at the Former Kutz Camp. As we gather at what is now called Mountain Lake Park with our wider community overlooking the body of water named for the beloved late Warwick resident and TBS member, Seymour Gordon, we will celebrate our community, our God, our tradition, and the gift that is the beauty of our natural world.

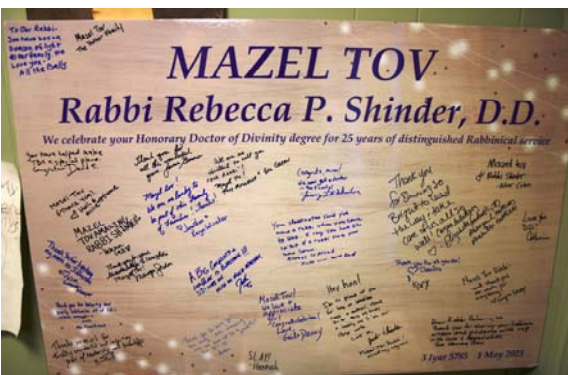

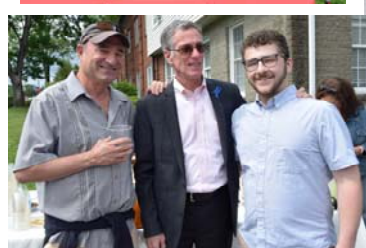

It is shocking and disgraceful that the largest teachers union in the country, the National Education Association, is calling for a boycott of ADL and our decades of education materials and data. 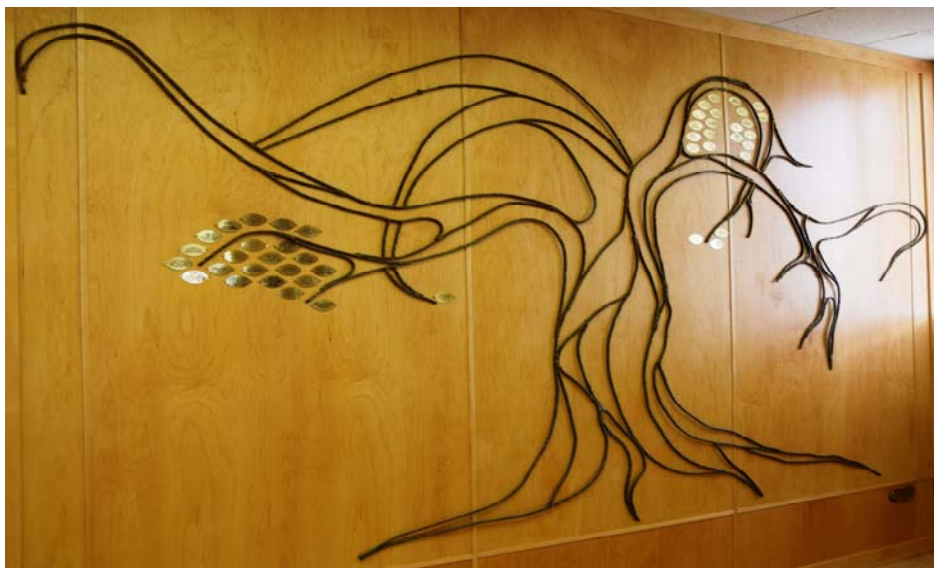
